

sufficient funding available. Discussion ensued regarding load factors and the possibility of purchasing a used generator.

On a motion by Member Gee, seconded by Member Hoffman, it was unanimously voted to recommend the item to the Board of Supervisors for review and approval.

3.4 Recommendation to Board of Supervisors for Waste Management's request for Rate Increase

Mr. Murphy explained that Waste Management is entitled to receive a rate increase to recover costs incurred in the previous year. This year's increase amounts to 3.55%. The "at curb" impact to the average County customer with a 64 gal tote would be just under \$1.00 per month. These rates do not affect City residents; however representatives from both the Cities can expect a similar increase when their rate review comes forward. Discussion ensued regarding additional services that may be available to customers if rate increase is approved and the advantages of aligning the Cities contract with the County Contract.

On a motion by Member Gee, seconded by Member Hoffman, it was unanimously voted to recommend the item to the Board of Supervisors for review and approval of a 3.55 % increase with consideration of aligning contracts.

4. DISCUSSION ITEMS

4.1 Mandatory Commercial Recycling

Mr. Murphy explained that Cal Recycle has determined that they need to provide more direction to local governments in order to assist in compliance with AB32. The Institute of Local Governments has provided a document explaining what is required of the local jurisdiction in order to comply with the new regulations, scheduled to take effect this fall. Staff will be bringing forward a future agenda item to the Waste Management Regional Agency for review and recommendation to the local governing bodies. Discussion ensued regarding voluntary compliance in order to avoid additional regulations.

4.2 Local Enforcement Agency Inspection Report

Members and staff reviewed Inspection Report. Mr. Murphy noted that compliance is improving. No further discussion was held.

4.3 Landfill Operations Update

Mr. Murray reported that staff continues to work on complying with rules and regulations. Mr. Murphy reported that staff continues to work to establish HHW collection services at the Landfill. Mr. Coles provided an update on the Closure Plan.
